Yea High School has a Uniform Policy and students are expected to wear the correct uniform at all times. The dress and grooming of students attending Yea High school is the responsibility of students and their families

The uniform conforms with health and safety guidelines.

All articles of clothing should be clearly named.

Shoes should fully enclose the foot to ensure maximum protection.

Year 12 VCE students design a different polo shirt and rugby top for their year.

All students are required to wear a wide brimmed school hat during Terms 1 and 4 as set out in the school's Sunsmart Policy.

Students not in uniform are to bring a note from parents explaining why uniform is not being worn. This note must be given to their Teacher Advisor prior to the commencement of the school day and logged on Compass. Parents of students who continually come to school out of uniform will be asked to attend an interview with the Principal.

Students with pierced ears may wear small plain studs or sleepers. Only clear nail polish permitted and make up must not be worn.

If there are any medical reasons why school shoes cannot be worn, a medical certificate must be produced and alternative black footwear agreed upon with the school.



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Casual Dress Day Guidelines

Students are not to wear lewd or inappropriate clothing to school and must dress respectfully.

Students are not to wear articles of clothing which are imprinted with suggestive or inappropriate graphics or statements or any clothing that is an advertisement for tobacco, drugs or alcoholic beverages. Also, pins and buttons of this nature are not to be worn. If they are they will be confiscated.

School council has determined that hooded style jumpers are not an acceptable item of clothing to be worn at school at any time, as they create safety and identification issues.
